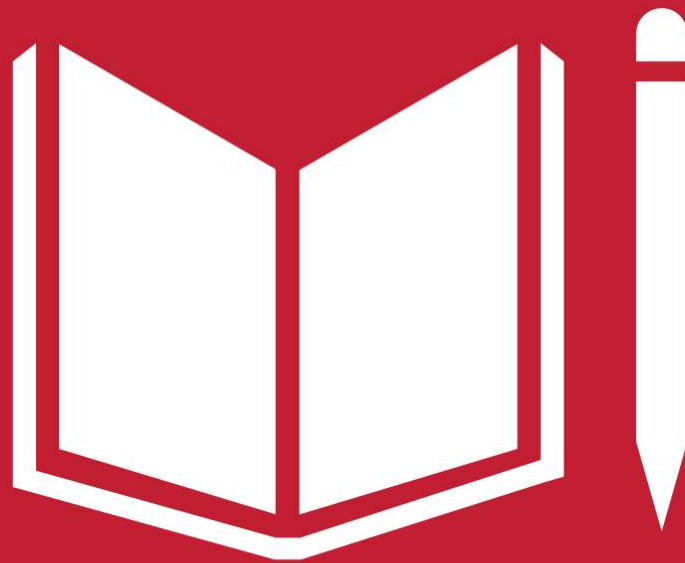

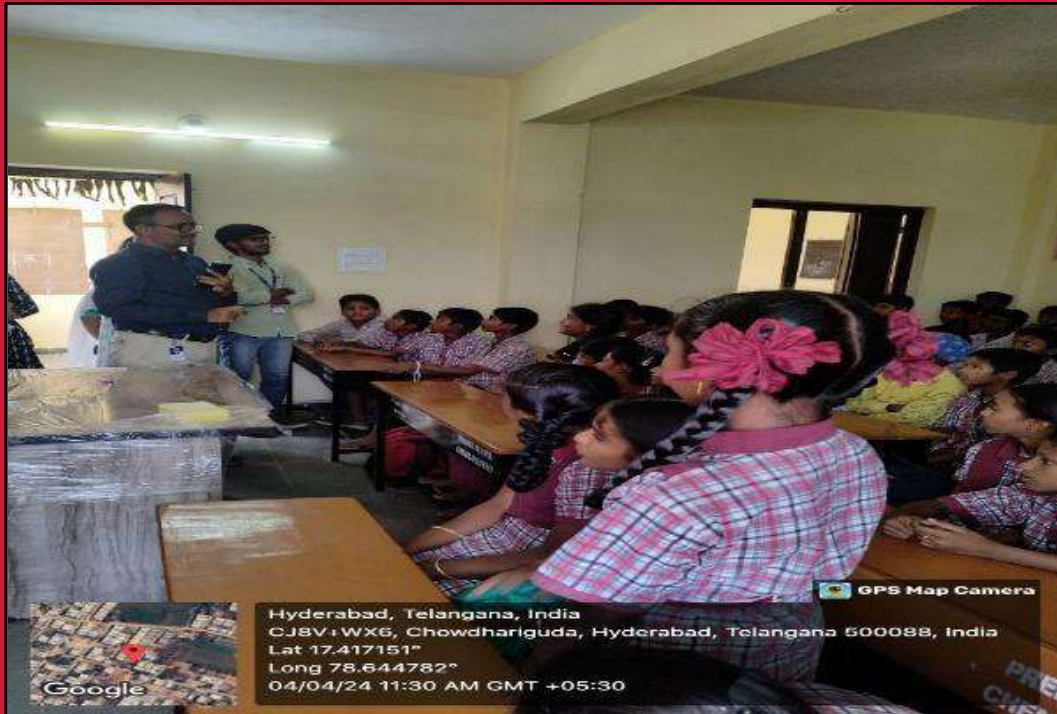

Conclusion:

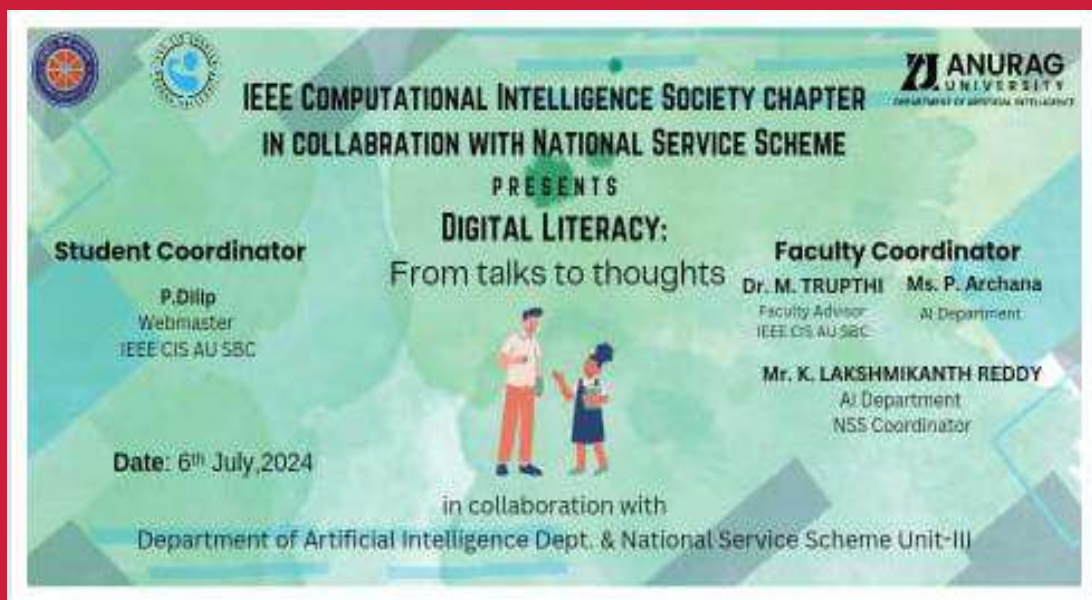

Road Safety Awareness Program:

The Road Safety Awareness Program was organized by the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit-III, NSS Cell, Anurag University, on 12.07.2024 at D- Block Seminar Hall. The objective of the program was to raise awareness about the importance of road safety and to educate students, faculty, and the local community about safe driving practices, adherence to traffic rules, and preventive measures to reduce road accidents.

Objective:

- To promote road safety and reduce accidents.
- To create awareness about the significance of traffic rules and safe driving.
- To engage students and community members in discussions and activities that emphasize road safety.
- To encourage responsible behavior as pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers.

Banner for the Event:



Significance: With increasing road accidents and fatalities, especially among the youth, it is important to address the issue of road safety. This initiative aimed to educate people about the dangers of traffic violations and to emphasize the need for responsible behavior on the roads.



The NSS Unit-III volunteers were divided into various groups, each responsible for a specific aspect of the program such as conducting workshops, creating awareness materials, and managing logistics. Volunteers worked closely with local traffic authorities to ensure the program's relevance and accuracy. The NSS Unit-III collaborated with local police, traffic authorities, and road safety experts of Pocharam IT corridor PS to organize the program. Professionals from hospitals and emergency services also participated by providing information on first aid and the importance of quick response in case of accidents.

Prior to the event, the NSS volunteers conducted awareness campaigns by distributing posters and pamphlets highlighting road safety tips. A social media campaign was also launched to encourage students to follow road safety rules and participate in the event.

Two Weeks Awareness Program on Traffic and Road Safety

Date: 13.07.2024 to 16.07.2024

The **Two Weeks Awareness Programme on Traffic and Road Safety** was organized by the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit-III, NSS Cell, Anurag University from 13.07.2024 to 16.07.2024. The primary objective of the program was to raise awareness about traffic safety among students, local residents, and the broader community. The program focused on educating participants about safe driving habits, traffic rules, and the consequences of traffic violations.

Objective:

- To educate the community about the importance of following traffic rules.
- To reduce road accidents by promoting awareness about road safety.
- To encourage safe driving and pedestrian practices.
- To inform the public about the significance of wearing seat belts, helmets, and adhering to speed limits.

Significance: With the increasing number of road accidents worldwide, road safety has become a critical issue. The program aimed to instill a sense of responsibility and awareness about road safety among participants, especially youth, who are more likely to be involved in accidents. NSS Unit-III volunteers were divided into teams, with specific roles assigned for organizing events, distributing educational materials, and conducting street awareness campaigns. Faculty members and local traffic police personnel were also involved in providing expert inputs and guidance, showing slogans in the placards, road accident images and videos etc.

NSS Unit III organized Traffic Awareness program at college for three days. The awareness program was started at 8:30 am before college gate. The volunteers who are part of this awareness program stood on the side of the road by catching placards having quotations related to traffic rules and penalties.

Volunteers stop the people who didn't follow the traffic rules and informed them about the rules and penalties that they will be charged. All the volunteers looked after the traffic and maintained clear road without any traffic jam.





The volunteers conducted meetings to prepare posters, pamphlets, and digital content (videos and social media posts) that emphasized traffic safety. Publicity for the event was done through posters, flyers, and announcements on social media platforms

The two-week program began with an inaugural session, where the Program Officer introduced the importance of traffic and road safety. Local traffic officers also gave talks on the legal aspects of road safety and the impact of accidents on individuals and society.

- **Traffic Rules and Regulations:** Understanding the basic traffic rules, road signs, and regulations.

- **Safe Driving Practices:** Emphasizing the importance of

following speed limits, wearing seatbelts, using helmets, and not using mobile phones while driving.

- **Pedestrian Safety:** Informing the public about pedestrian rights and how to walk safely on roads.

- **First Aid for Road Accidents:** Basic first aid training for dealing with road accidents and how to assist victims until help arrives.

- **Street Awareness Campaigns:** Volunteers took to the streets to distribute pamphlets, posters, and stickers promoting road safety. They also conducted live demonstrations about pedestrian safety, safe crossing practices, and the importance of wearing helmets and seat belts.
- **Road Safety Rallies:** A road safety rally was organized, where volunteers, students, and local residents participated by marching through the streets, holding placards and banners with road safety slogans like “Safety First” and “Follow Traffic Rules.”
